FEEDING THE HUNGRY

FEBRUARY SPECIAL GIVING

Why are we always asking for donations of casseroles and cookies? Because for several years St. James

has been providing two evening meals a month to the ECHO Shelter which has been serving over 100 people a night.

On the third Wednesday we also make and deliver 40 lunches consisting of a turkey and cheese sandwich and condiments, a small bag of chips, a cup of applesauce, and two cookies.

Our assigned days are the third Wednesday and third Friday of each month. For each meal we deliver 10 casseroles (each serving 10), 7 loaves of buttered and sliced French bread, two large trays of green salad which includes tomatoes and grated carrots and dressing, and a dessert of brownies or cookies.

And how do we possibly do this? Only because of the amazing offering of time and talent and money by many people from our congregation. Some people donate money to cover the cost of various food items and supplies such as aluminum pans and paper bags. For the Wednesday meals three people make 10 casseroles. For the Friday meals we use the donated casseroles that are in the freezer. People donate cookies – lots of cookies! It takes 15 dozen cookies to serve everyone. One person bakes and donates brownies for the Wednesday meals. One person makes and donates the salads for both meals. One person makes and bags 40 sets of cookies for the lunch bags. One person turns on the oven to heat. Another puts the casseroles into the oven at the appropriate time. Others butter, slice, and wrap 7 loaves of bread for heating. One team makes the sandwiches. Another team fills the lunch sacks. Others take everything out of the oven, put the hot items into transport boxes, and deliver everything to the shelter. St. James has an incredible team of volunteers!

Below is a list of items that are needed and would be easy for us to collect. I will place a specially-marked bin in the parish hall for collection of these items and then take them over to the United Methodist Church, who will distribute them to families on regularly scheduled days. It would be an easy thing for all of us to add one or more of these items to our routine grocery lists and then bring them to the church for distribution, and a realistic and worthy local ministry for St. James. I know you are all doing a lot already, but I also know that your hearts are always capable of further expansion in your ongoing love of your neighbor. With much gratitude and thanks, Deacon Jim!

Rice – 2 or 4 lb bag
Sugar – 4 lb bag
Canola oil – 48 oz
Strawberry jam – 32 oz

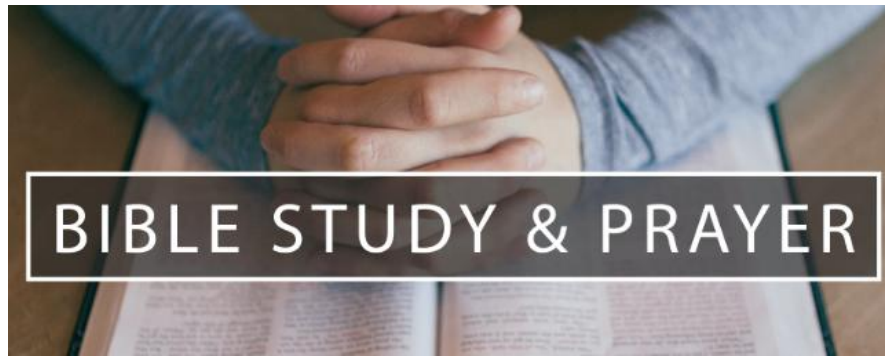

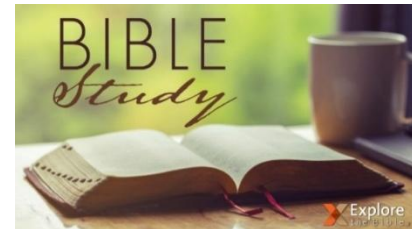
WEDNESDAY EVENING SERVICE
