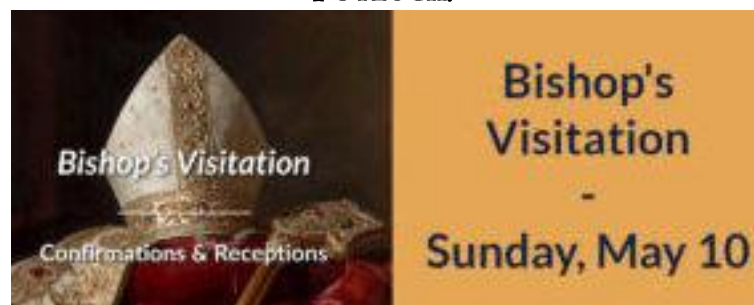

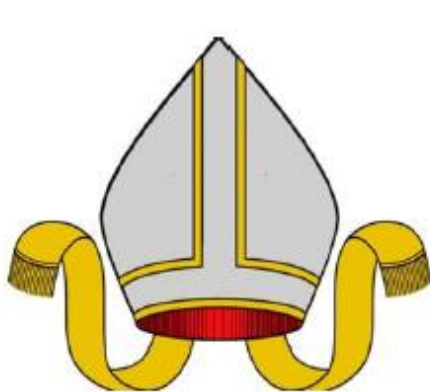
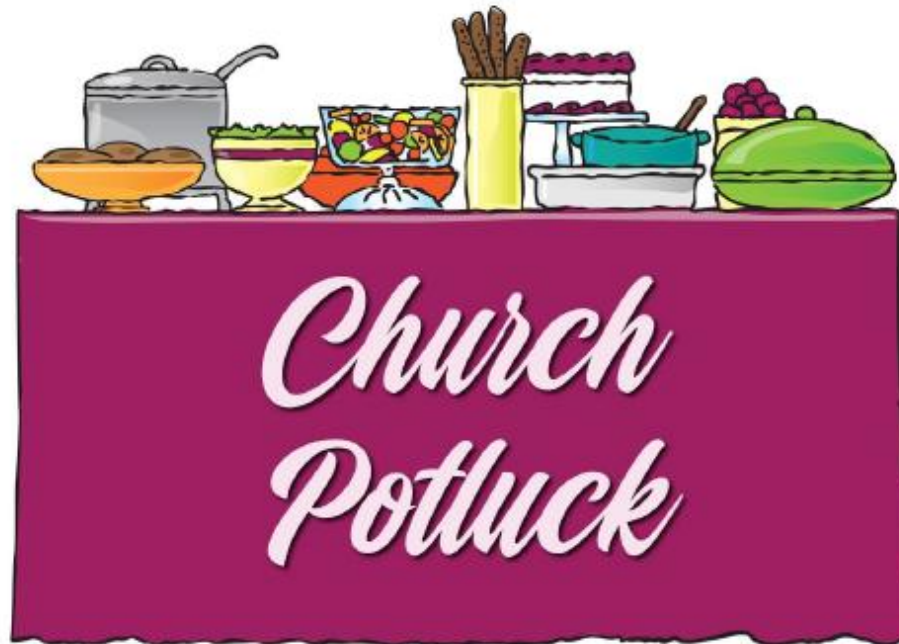

WAYSIDE CROSS



Have you wanted to take a beautiful Sunday drive into the hills outside Parkfield? Have you wanted to sing or play to praise God in our beautiful environment? We will be celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Wayside Cross on **May 9th!** On the top of a hill, not far from Parkfield, stands a large, stone Celtic cross. It marks the place where Bishop Nichols would often stop in his journeys to rest and for prayer.

Please bring your own lunch, including beverages, lawn chairs, blankets, and whatever other “creature comforts” you might need. Restroom facilities will be available.

A caravan will be leaving the San Miguel Mission parking lot promptly at 1:45 p.m.. The mission is located 10 miles north of Paso Robles on Hwy. 101. Take Hwy. 101 north from Paso Robles to the San Miguel exit. About 3 blocks north of the Mission,

follow the sign for Parkfield pointing east. Crossing the river on the new bridge, turn left onto Indian Valley Road and follow the signs to Parkfield. Watch for the “Wayside Cross” signs on the left approximately 14 miles from San Miguel.

Help Needed

We will soon embark on our annual pilgrimage to the Wayside Cross. I am looking for someone who can place the directional signs out for those who haven't been there before. Mac is unable to do it this year as he will be at the Parkfield Bluegrass Festival that weekend. We will need them put out about 1:00 PM on **Saturday, May 9th** for the folks leaving the mission at 1:30. If you are able to do this please notify me and I can get the signs to you.

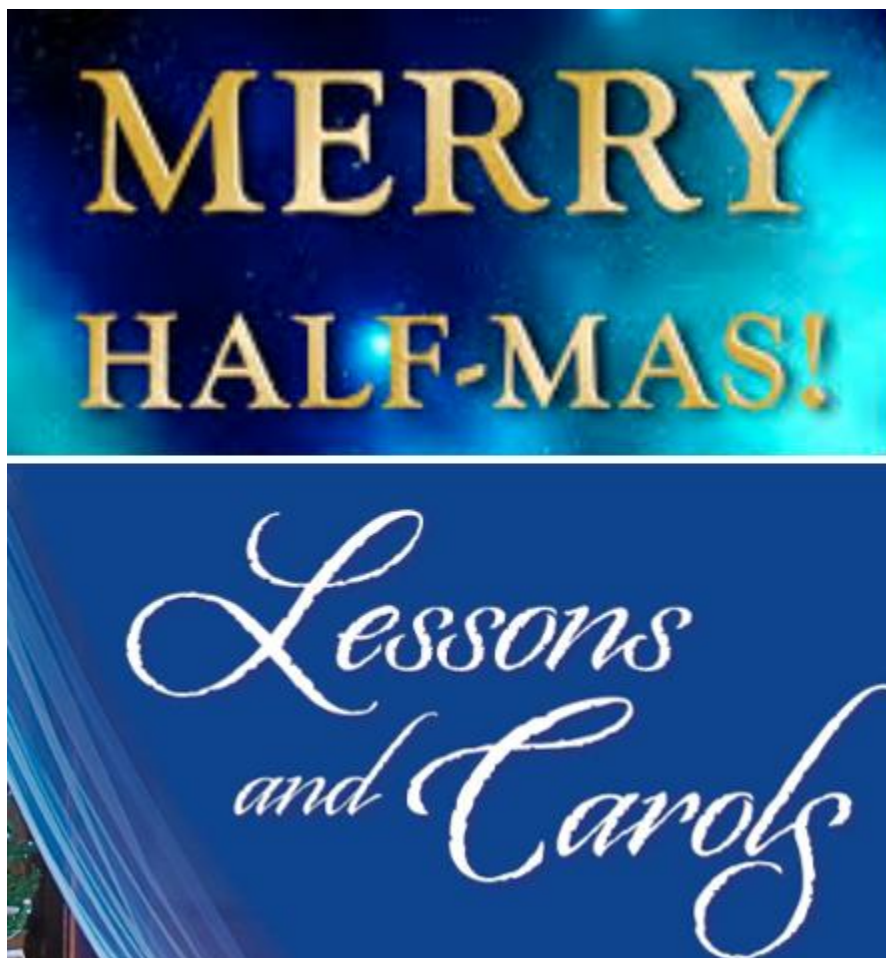
Outreach Needs

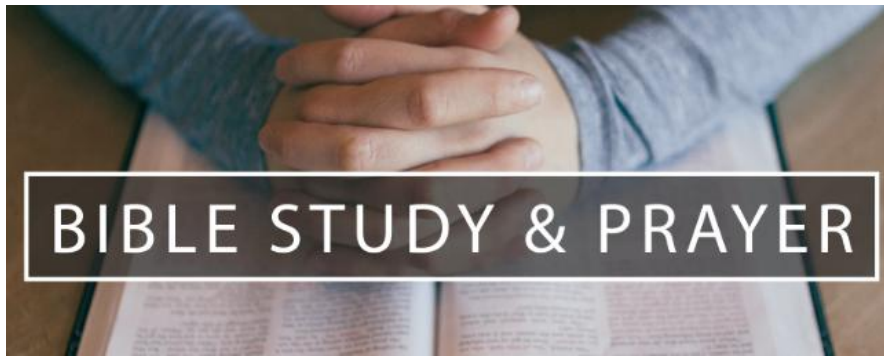

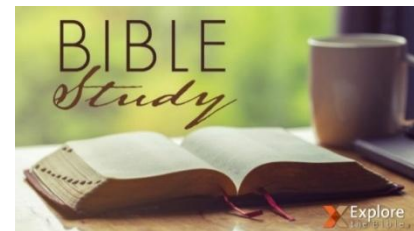
WEDNESDAY EVENING SERVICE
