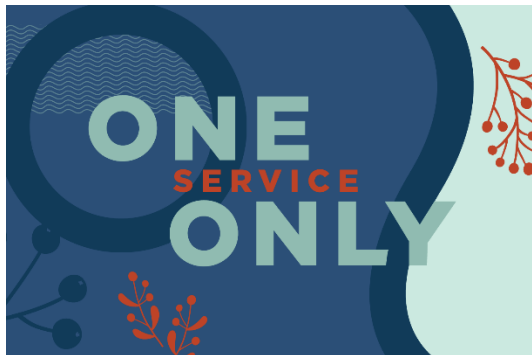

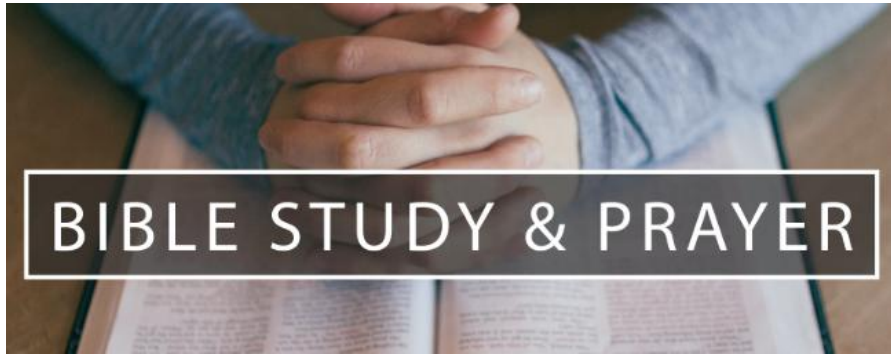

### WEDNESDAY EVENING SERVICE

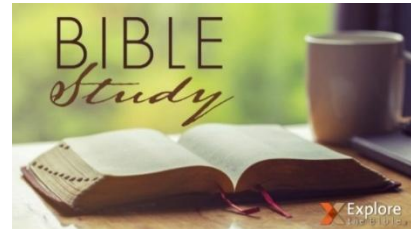
